We the undersigned call on you, as Chief Secretary to the Treasury, to immediately remove the 1% pay cap and enable civil service employers to start the process of restoring the value of civil service pay by enabling them to negotiate increases in civil service pay above the rate of inflation¹

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¹ As a result of the 1% cap on public sector pay, the value of average civil service pay has fallen by between 8 and 9% when compared to the Consumer Price Index rate of inflation (CPI). The value of average earnings in the civil service has fallen further than in the rest of the public sector (by 3-4%), and in the economy as a whole (by 7-8%). If the pay cap continues until 2020, average civil service pay will have fallen in value by between 12% if the CPI is used to measure inflation and 20.4% if the Retail Price Index (RPI) is used to measure inflation.
